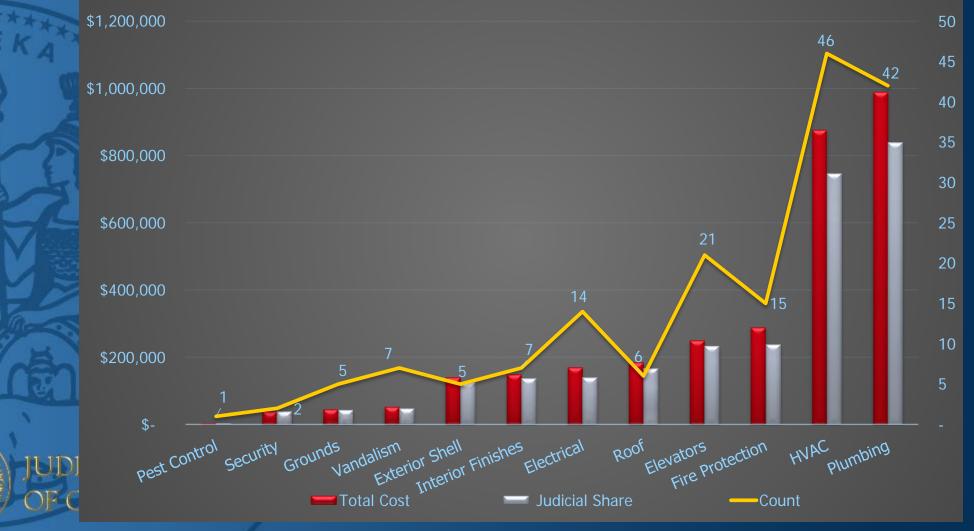

Background

The Judicial Council (JC) has a new opportunity to achieve significant savings on energy costs for the New Sonora Courthouse by joining a non-profit power agency.

In 2013, the JC established a precedent for this approach when it authorized membership in the Calaveras Public Power Agency (CPPA), a Joint Powers Authority (JPA), to provide lower cost energy for the New San Andreas Courthouse.

Executive Summary

The Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) recommends seeking agency membership in the Calaveras Public Power Agency (CPPA), a joint powers agency (JPA) that provides electricity to public facilities in the County of Calaveras. To take advantage of the lower electricity rates of the CPPA, the AOC would have to become a member agency of the CPPA, which provides electricity to various local facilities in Calaveras County, including the county jail, the county government center, schools, hospitals, fire stations, and water and wastewater treatment plants. With the AOC as a member of the CPPA, the new San Andreas Courthouse in Calaveras County (New Courthouse) would be able to enjoy the benefits of electricity rates lower than PG&E rates. In addition, construction costs of the New Courthouse project would be reduced by approximately \$115,000, related to equipment no longer required.

Judicial Council Membership in Tuolumne Public Power Agency for New Sonora Courthouse

Annual Savings, San Andreas Courthouse

For the San Andreas Courthouse, staff conservatively estimated annual electricity savings at greater than \$20,000 based on a comparison of rates of \$.21 per kWh from PG&E and \$.071/kWh from the CPPA.

Actual 2020 savings for the San Andreas Courthouse were almost \$53,000.

The cost of electricity in 2020 with kWh usage of almost 800,000 (791,973) was \$56,706 at the CPPA rate of \$.071/kWh. For that same usage, PG&E would have charged \$109,609, based on their median rate of \$.21/kWh, resulting in a savings of \$53,000.

New Sonora Courthouse – Tuolumne Public Power Agency (TPPA) Membership

Benefits

Historically lower rates than PG&E
Flat rate for consumption, eliminating time-of-use or accelerated rates for peak use times
More reliable power and quicker restoration of power than investor-owned utilities
Estimated annual savings of \$102,500

Risks

•Possibility of rate increase in event of additional TPPA operational costs; however, the risk is significantly lower compared with PG&E as TPPA is not permitted to generate profit

• If TPPA dissolves, the Judicial Council of California could become responsible for some portion of any outstanding public pension liabilities to the extent any exist. Staff views this risk as very low, given that the TPPA does not have any employees or pension liability at present, but that will be re-evaluated on ongoing basis.

Process/Cost

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•Requires approval by the Judicial Council

• Process involves:

Adopting a resolution;

Submitting a membership application;

Becoming a member agency through a Joint Powers Authority (JPA);

Paying one-time membership fee of \$0.009/kWh projected electricity use (\$7,400); and

Appointing a representative to the TPPA for ongoing representation.

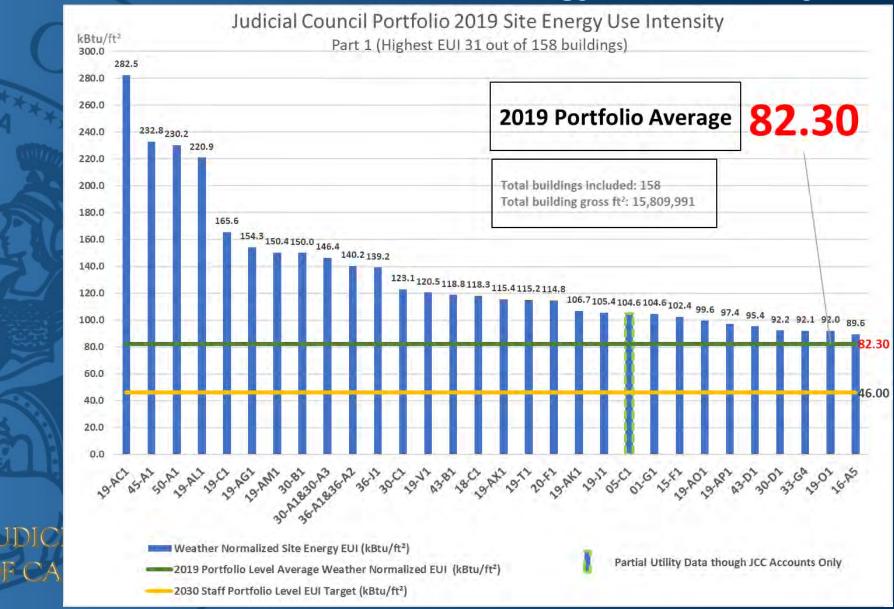
On April 12th, we shared energy usage data for the branch portfolio using the measurement called EUI - Energy Use Intensity.

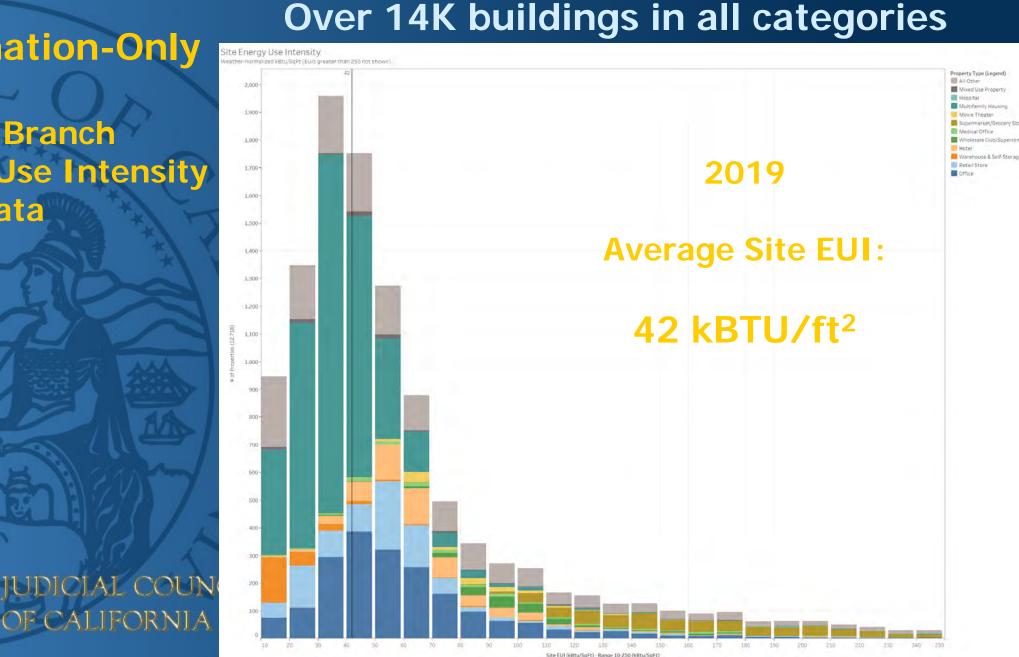

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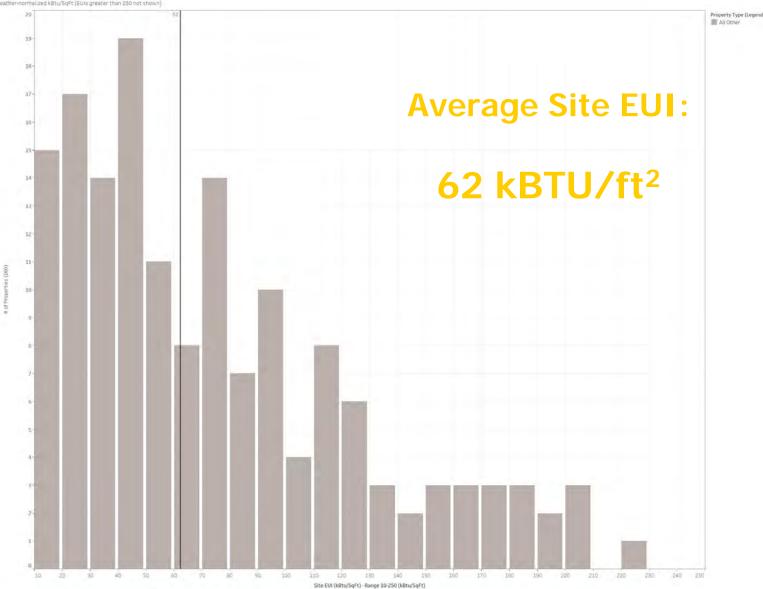
