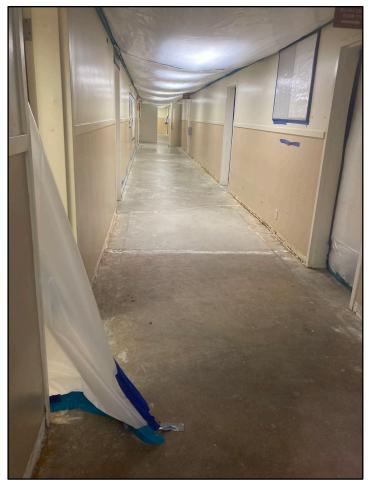

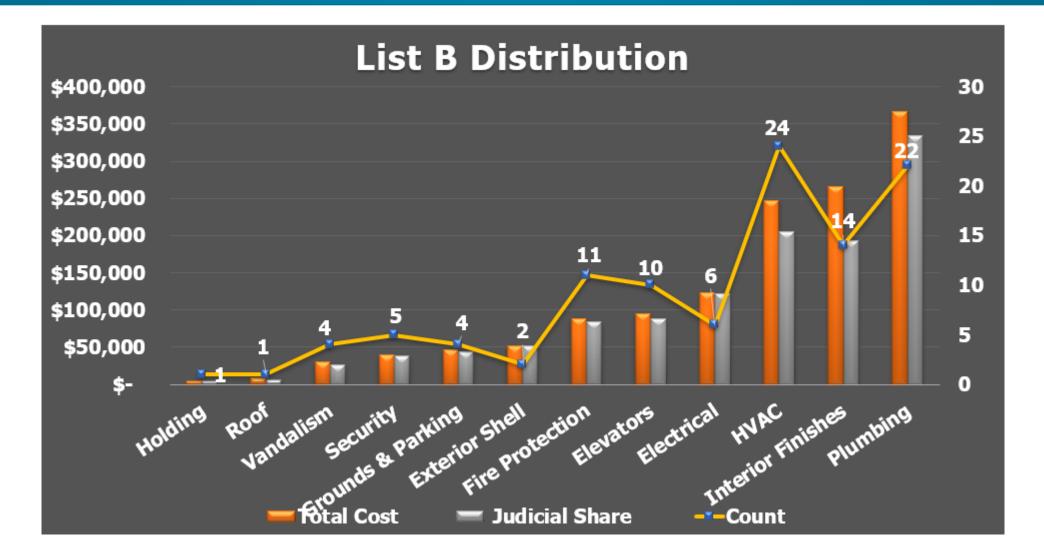

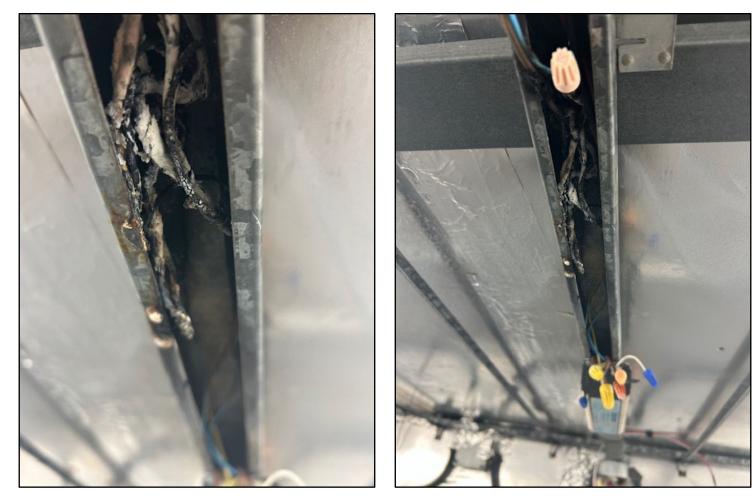

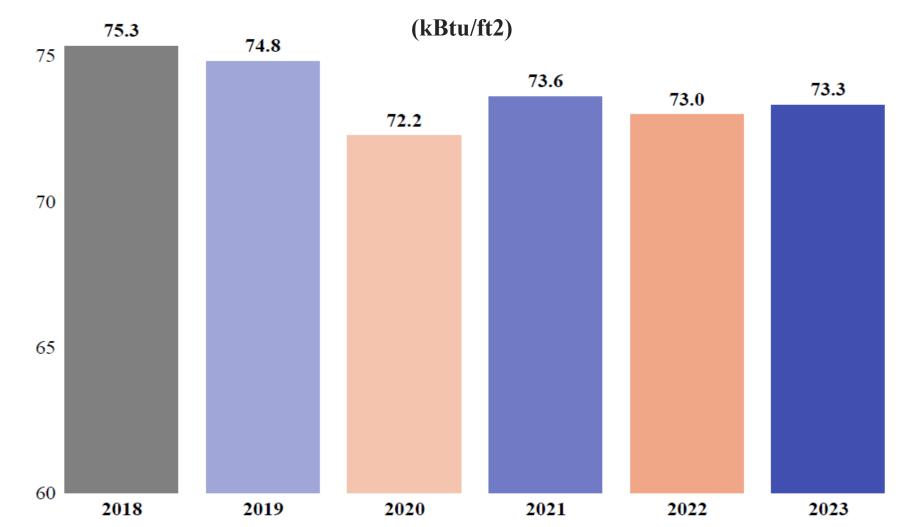

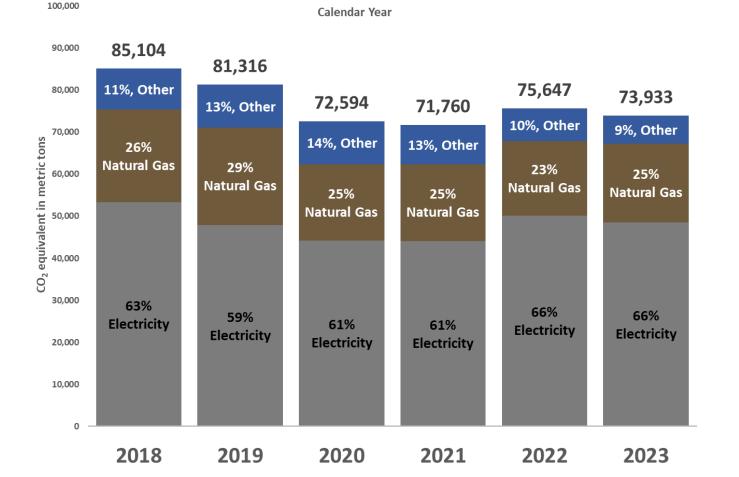

Imperial Court – Past Due SWOs

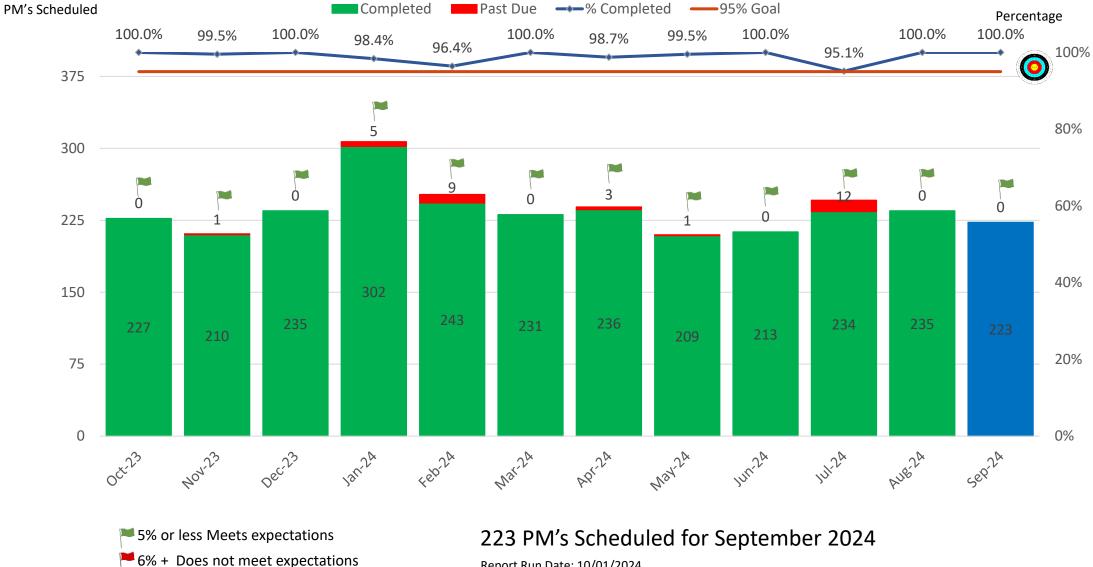

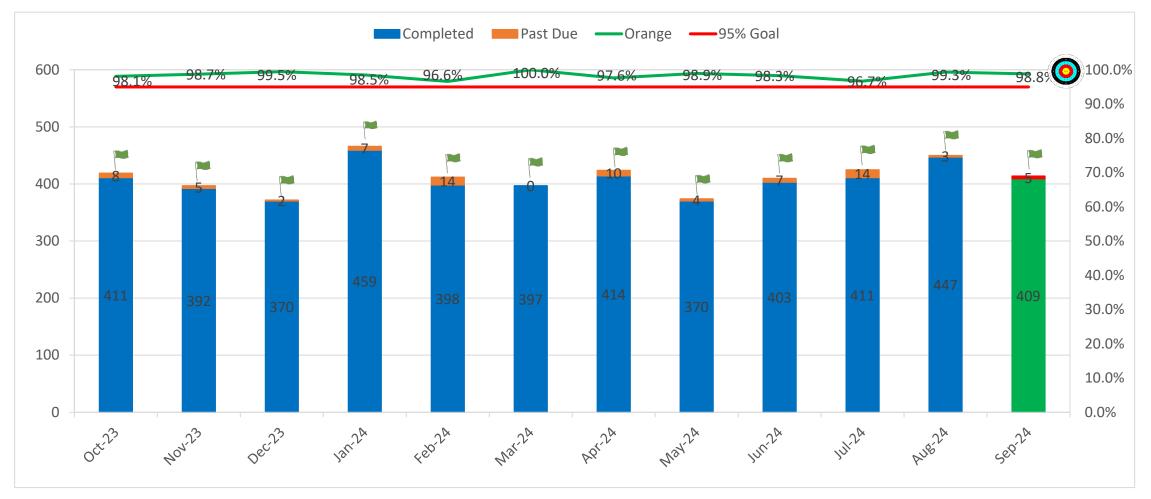

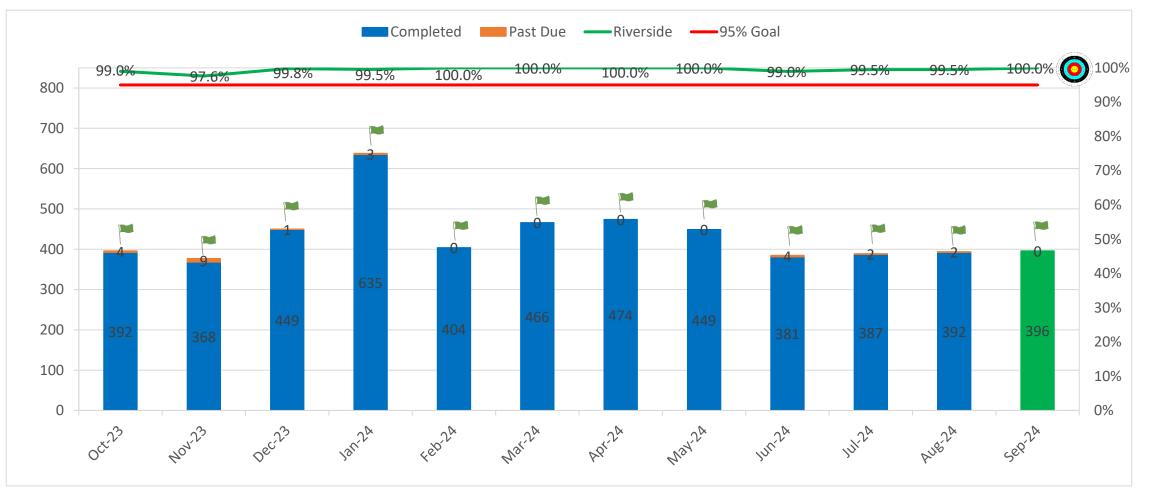
