## A Guide to Section One: Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise (DVBE)

The section focuses on Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises (DVBEs), and will be particularly useful for prime bidders and state agencies seeking DVBEs to fulfill a contract participation goal.

he State of California acknowledges the service and sacrifice of its disabled veterans, in part, through the "Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise (DVBE) Participation Program." With the DVBE program, state agencies have a goal to award at least 3% of their annual contract dollars to certified DVBEs. It is up to the state agency to decide whether or not a particular contract will contain a DVBE participation goal and what the percentage of that goal will be. The result is that some contracts may have a goal of more than 3%, some may have a goal of less than 3%, and some contracts may have no DVBE participation goal.

#### Meeting DVBE Participation Goals

When a firm bids on a state contract that contains a DVBE participation goal, the bid must address how the firm intends to meet the DVBE goal. If the bidding firm does not address the DVBE participation goal, the bid will be considered "non-responsive."

A firm has two options for meeting a DVBE participation goal:

- Locate and commit to certified DVBE firms who will perform at least 3%, or the percent of work specified by the contract; or
- 2. Reference an approved DVBE Utilization Plan.

If full goal attainment is not achieved, the bidder's "good faith effort" to attain the goal must be documented to meet DVBE Participation Program requirements.

## What Role Can a DVBE Play in My Bid?

There are hundreds of certified DVBEs who provide a wide range of services and goods. These firms are composed of capable businesspeople who want to build business partnerships to help their businesses succeed and grow.

When you're deciding what portion of the contract can best be performed by a DVBE, think broadly about all the commodities and services needed to complete the contract you're bidding on.

The California Code of Regulations state that the DVBE (or DVBEs) you choose must play a "commercially useful function" in the state contract you're bidding on. A DVBE contractor, subcontractor or supplier is considered performing a commercially useful function when it meets the following criteria:

(1) The business concern is: responsible for the execution of a distinct element of the work of the contract; carrying out its obligation by actually performing, managing or supervising the work involved; and performing work that is normal for its business services and function, and (2) the business concern is not further subcontracting a greater portion of the work than would be expected by normal industry practices.

Again, think broadly about how you can use a DVBE. For example:

- Can a DVBE supply a portion of the commodities?
- Are there any special supplies needed to perform the contract?
- What about shipping or warehousing?
- Can a DVBE perform part of a study or survey?

You know the job best. Where do you think a DVBF fits in?

What is a "Certified" DVBE?

When a firm bids on a state contract that has a DVBE participation goal, the firm *must* address how it intends to comply with the goal. If the bidding firm does not address the DVBE participation goal, the bid will be considered "non-responsive."

A certified DVBE is a business currently certified by the State of California, Office of Small Business Certification and Resources.

To receive DVBE certification, a business must:

- Be at least 51% owned by one or more disabled veterans;
- 2) Have its daily business operations managed and controlled by one or more disabled veterans. The disabled veterans who exercise management and control are not required to be the same disabled veterans who own the business: and
- Have its home office located in the United States. The home office cannot be a branch or subsidiary of a foreign corporation, foreign firm, or other foreign-based business.

The law defines a disabled veteran as a United States military, naval or air service veteran with a service related disability of at least 10 percent and who is a resident of the State of California.

#### California Department of Veterans Affairs Appoints DVBE Advocate

Assembly Bill 409, which goes into effect January 1, 2000, requires the California Department of Veterans Affairs to appoint a DVBE Advocate.

The new advocate's primary responsibility is to work with state agencies and DVBEs to achieve the goals of the DVBE Participation Program. This includes disseminating information, promoting and coordinating DVBE outreach efforts, and coordinating report submittal.

## Compliance Option #1: Finding a DVBE to Perform the Percent of Work Specified in the Contract

- Obtaining a Printed List of DVBEs
- How to Find DVBEs on the Internet

The OSBCR maintains a database of certified DVBEs. The database is available in two formats:

- 1. A printed list, updated quarterly; and
- 2. An Internet database, updated daily, which can be searched on-line.

If you have Internet access, you can use the on-line database to meet all your bidding and documentation requirements; you do not need to request a printed list.

#### About the Printed DVBE List...

- The printed list of DVBEs is updated quarterly. Be sure you have the most current list.
- The list is lengthy and cannot be FAX'd, but we will gladly mail it to you.

To request a copy of the most current, printed DVBE list, you have two options:

1. Call our receptionist, Monday through Friday between the hours of 8am and 5pm at (916)323-5478.

-OR-

 Call our 24 hour information and document request system at (916)322-5060. You will be instructed to leave your name and mailing address.

No matter what option you choose, your

DVBE list will be mailed immediately.

## About the On-Line DVBE Database...

- The Internet DVBE database is "realtime," meaning that the minute a DVBE firm is certified, that firm is entered into the database and will appear in an on-line database query.
- The Internet DVBE database allows specific queries, based on the type of firms you're looking for and the area of the state in which you're searching.

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#### What To Do Once You Have a List of Potential DVBE Firms

Whether you obtained a list of potential DVBE subcontractors through the mail, or created one on the Internet, you'll want to know the following information about how to read the list and how to invite DVBEs to participate in your bid.

#### **Reading Your DVBE List**

The list will contain the following information about each DVBE:

- Reference Number (the number the firm received from OSBCR upon application)
- Firm Name and Address
- Phone and FAX Numbers
- E-mail address and homepage, if available
- The "Certification Type" for which the firm is approved (DVBE and/or Small Business)
- The "Business Type" for which the firm is approved (Manufacturer, Non-Manufacturer, Service and/or Construction)
- The firm's certification start and end date ("From" and "To")
- The SIC (Standard Industrial Classification codes) or construction licenses provided by the DVBE to identify the products or services the firm offers

#### **Inviting DVBEs to Participate**

Invite potential DVBE bidders to participate by supplying them with all the information they need to bid, such as:

- The service or product available for bid
- The geographic area where the work will take place, if applicable

- The awarding department
- The bid opening date
- Any other information needed to bid

The method you use for contacting DVBEs is up to you, but be sure that you give each DVBE the same information and instructions. You should document—and be prepared to demonstrate—the efforts you make in seeking a DVBE.

### Compliance Option #2: Referencing an Approved DVBE Utilization Plan

The following paragraphs provide an overview of the DVBE Utilization Plan option. If you think this option might work for your business, request a DVBE Utilization Plan application by calling (916) 323-5478.

#### What is a DVBE Utilization Plan?

A DVBE Utilization Plan is a written commitment to contract with certified DVBEs for at least 3% of your firm's anticipated cost of doing business over the next year (includes subcontracts and operating expenses). This 3% applies to *all* business done by your firm—not just contracts with the State of California.

State agencies accept approved utilization plans when awarding contracts for commodities and information technology (IT) goods and services.

## Who Can Submit a DVBE Utilization Plan?

Any firm that intends to bid on state contracts for commodities and IT goods and services (described by law as "materials, supplies or equipment, including electronic data processing and telecommunications goods and services") may file a utilization plan. However, each firm should decide if a utilization plan is the best method for achieving the DVBE participation goal. This decision requires an evaluation of your firm's total California expenses versus the value of state contracts you anticipate being

awarded. The higher the percentage of state contracts you anticipate being awarded, the more sense it makes to consider the utilization plan option

Some things to consider:

- An approved utilization plan saves time when you prepare a bid proposal because you simply cite the approved plan on your proposal rather than seeking out DVBEs to fulfil the needs of that particular contract.
- The preparation of a utilization plan and the subsequent reporting requirements take time and commitment. If you only bid on a few state contracts each year, it may be easier to simply fulfill the DVBE requirements each time you bid.
- A utilization plan is a commitment to contract at least 3% of your firm's anticipated cost of doing business over the next year. If you fail to meet that commitment, you may be prevented from doing future business with the state for up to 2 years.

## Submit Your DVBE Utilization Plan Early

If you are submitting a plan which is intended to satisfy DVBE goals for a particular state agency solicitation, the plan must be approved by the Department of General Services, Office of Small Business

Certification and Resources, prior to the bid opening date.

Public Contract Code states that a Utilization Plan shall be considered approved "as of the date submitted . . . so long as the plan meets the minimum criteria." So, technically, your plan may be submitted the same day the bid is due, and if you've done everything correctly, your plan will be approved and will satisfy the DVBE requirements of the solicitation on which you are bidding.

However, waiting until the last day to submit your plan is risky because if it contains any errors or omissions, they must be corrected before the plan can be approved.

If you plan to submit a DVBE Utilization Plan, submit it as early as possible to allow time for revisions.

## To Request a DVBE Utilization Plan Application

You may request a DVBE Utilization Plan application by calling OSBCR at (916) 323-5478. An application will be mailed to you.

Some contracts are so specialized that it is difficult to find a DVBE to fill the required participation goal. For these special circumstances the state has created a method whereby bidders go through a series of proscribed steps, all of which are designed to help the bidder locate a DVBE. If the bidder does not locate a DVBE after performing these steps, it serves to demonstrate to the awarding agency that a credible effort was made.

The "good faith effort" consists of five, legally defined steps. Each step is intended to help bidders identify qualified DVBEs and attain DVBE participation.

In summary, the five steps of the Good Faith Effort are:

- 1. Contact the awarding department to identify DVBEs.
- Contact other state and federal agencies, and local DVBE organizations to identify DVBEs.
- 3. Publish advertisements in trade papers and papers focusing on DVBEs.
- 4. Invite potential DVBE contractors to bid.
- 5. Consider interested DVBEs. In detail, the five steps of the good faith

effort are:

# **STEP 1:** Contact the awarding department to identify DVBEs.

The contact is for the purpose of identifying potential DVBE subcontractors and/or suppliers, not merely to request the solicitation package.

The awarding department may respond with:

- A list of DVBEs who have expressed interest in the contract.
- A list of DVBEs who have participated or expressed interest in prior contracts.
- Use of an internal database or directory.
- Referral to other resource or service providers.

**STEP 2:** Contact other state

Each step of the Good Faith Effort is designed to help you find qualified DVBEs to bid on your project.

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#### and federal agencies, and local DVBE organizations to identify DVBEs.

Internet contact is acceptable. It is suggested that bidders print out the applicable pages and submit with the bid package.

# **STEP 3:** Publish Advertisements in DVBE Trade and Focus Papers

Bidder's must advertise their subcontracting opportunities:

- in at least one "Trade" and one "Focus" paper (see definitions below)
- at least 14 calendar days prior to the due date of the solicitation response, unless a different time frame is specified in the solicitation package.

Advertisements should be specific enough to encourage responses from potential DVBE subcontractors and/or suppliers, and typically include the following information:

- Identify the awarding department
- Identify the bid solicitation

- State the bid opening date
- Identify the type of work available for bid or supplies needed
- Request bids or quotes from DVBE subcontractors or suppliers
- Specify the geographical area/location where the work will take place

## Awarding Agency's Ability to Waive Step 3

Step 3 is the one step that the awarding agency has the authority to waive. If the awarding agency waives the advertising requirement, they will either include this information in the solicitation package or in an addendum to the solicitation package. In such a case, advertising will be waived for all bidders. In no case can advertising be waived for one bidder and not another.

**TRADE PAPER**: A Trade Paper is one that meets all of the following criteria:

- has a business orientation relating to the trade or industry for which the advertisement is being placed;
- 2. is known and used by the members of that trade or industry;
- primarily offers articles, editorials (if any), and advertisements of business opportunities aimed at that trade or industry; AND,
- 4. is available within the geographical area in which the advertisement is placed and the services are to be performed.

**FOCUS PAPER**: A Focus Paper is one that meets all of the following criteria:

- has an orientation relating to disabled veteran business enterprise(s);
- 2. is known and used by the members of the disabled veteran business enterprise community;
- primarily offers articles, editorials (if any), and advertisements of business opportunities aimed at disabled veteran business enterprises; AND
- 4. is available within the geographical

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area in which the advertisement is placed and the services are to be performed.

The number and type of publications required may vary from contract to contract. Be sure to read the solicitation documents carefully for specific instructions on advertising, and contact the awarding agency if you have any questions.

#### **Dual Trade and Focus Papers**

Some papers are both Trade and Focus. The awarding agency has the discretion to accept one advertisement in a consolidated trade and focus paper as long as the trade and focus paper meets both legal definitions and the criteria for the specific bid. The awarding agency must specify in its solicitation if a dual trade and focus paper is acceptable.

#### TRADE PAPERS

Bidders should use the trade publications that best target their intended trade or industry.

## **STEP 4:** Invite Potential DVBE Contractors to Bid

The contacts made in Steps 1-3 should have established a list of potential DVBE subcontractors and suppliers. Step 4 requires the prime bidder to invite these potential DVBE bidders to supply the needed service or supply.

Invite potential DVBE bidders to bid by supplying them with all the information they need in order to respond, such as:

- 1. The service or product available for bid
- 2. The geographic area where the work will take place, if applicable
- 3. The awarding department
- 4. The bid opening date
- 5. Any other information needed to bid

The invitation you make must be specific enough so that a bid reply may be made. The invitation must also be equal; for example, if bonding assistance is offered to one potential subcontractor, it must be offered to all.

You may invite potential DVBE bidders to bid via:

- direct mail
- telephone
- FAX
- E-mail
- or through referral centers.

Make sure that the solicitation method used meets bid documentation requirements.

If you use a service firm or referral center...

...that assists prime bidders with the completion of requirements for DVBE goal attainment and good faith effort, the prime contractor is responsible to demonstrate Steps 4 and 5.

## **STEP 5:** Consider Available DVBFs

To fulfil Step 5, the bidder must:

- Consider all DVBE responses, using the same evaluation criteria for each.
- If the bidder decides not to select a potential subcontractor, the business reasons for non-selection must be documented and submitted to the awarding agency.
- And—as always—document the effort.

If you use a service firm or referral center...

...that assists prime bidders with the completion of requirements for DVBE goal attainment and good faith effort, the prime contractor is responsible to demonstrate Steps 4 and 5.

## What the Awarding Department Looks For

The awarding department evaluates the effort made by the bidder to seek out and consider DVBEs as potential subcontractors.

In evaluating the bidder's effort, the awarding department requires written evidence that the bidder completed all 5 steps of the good faith effort (unless the awarding department waived Step 3--the advertising requirement--in which case no evidence is required).

Based on this evaluation, the awarding department, at its sole discretion, may find that the bidder has complied with the program requirements. If a bidder fails to meet the participation program requirements, the bidder shall be deemed non-responsive, and is thus ineligible for a contract award.

#### **DVBE Program Requirements**

The following information is provided to give readers a general understanding of the regulations relevant to the DVBE Participation Program. The information provided here has been excerpted and paraphrased from the actual codes and regulations. Readers should refer to the referenced code or regulation for complete information.

#### **Program Violations**

[Reference PCC §10115.10]:

It is unlawful for a person or firm to:

- 1. Knowingly and with intent to defraud, or fraudulently obtain or retain Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise (DVBE) certification.
- 2. Willfully and knowingly make a false statement with the intent to defraud, or to influence any entity's DVBE certification.
- 3. Willfully and knowingly obstruct, impede or attempt to obstruct or impede any state official or employee who is investigating a business entity's qualifications regarding the requested acceptance or certification as a DVBE.
- 4. Knowingly and with intent to defraud, obtaining or attempting to obtain public moneys to which the person is not entitled under the DVBE Participation Program.
- 5. Establish or cooperate in the establishment of, or exercise control over, a firm found to have violated any of the above.

Program violations should be reported to the awarding agency. Awarding agencies will investigate and report DVBE Participation Program violations to the OSBCR. The OSBCR will subsequently forward the allegations to the attorney general for possible action.

Violators are guilty of a misdemeanor and may also be liable for a civil penalty. Additionally, violators shall be suspended from bidding on, or participating as either a contractor, subcontractor, or supplier in any

state contract or project. [Reference CCR 2, §1896.80]

Prior to reporting an alleged violation of PCC § 10115.10 to the DGS, Office of Small Business Certification & Resources, awarding agencies must investigate the alleged violation and shall prepare a written report of their findings. The written report must also include an action recommendation to be taken commensurate with the awarding agency's findings and must be submitted to the OSBCR within 60 days of notification to the awarding agency of the alleged violation.

In the court ruling of Monterey Mechanical vs. Wilson, the California Minority and Women Business Enterprise (M/WBE) Participation Program requirements of PCC § 10115, et seq., were found unconstitutional, thereby eliminating the M/WBE participation goals from state contracts. This ruling does not apply to state contracts which are federally funded.

#### Substitution of a DVBE

[Reference CCR 2, §1896.64 c-d)]

- 1) After a contract award, the successful bidder/contractor must use the DVBE subcontractors and/or suppliers proposed in the solicitation response to the state, unless a substitution is requested. The bidder/contractor must request the substitution in writing to the awarding agency and the awarding agency must approve the substitution in writing prior to commencement of any work by the new subcontractor/supplier. At a minimum, the substitution request must include:
- a) A written explanation of the substitution reason; and if applicable, the contractor must also include the reason a non-DVBE subcontractor is proposed for use. (See specific explanations in item 4 below as identifiable substitution reasons.)
- b) A written description of the substitute business enterprise, including their business status as a
- sole proprietorship, partnership,

- corporation or other entity, and
- the firm's DVBE certification status, if any.
- c) A written notice detailing a clearly defined portion of the work identified both as a task and as a percentage share/dollar amount of the overall contract that the substitute firm will perform.
- 2) The request for substitution of the DVBE subcontractor/supplier must be approved in writing by the awarding department prior to the commencement of any work by the subcontractor/supplier.
- 3) The DVBE substitution request and the awarding agency's approval or disapproval cannot be used as an excuse for noncompliance with any other law provision, including, but not limited to, the Subletting and Subcontracting Fair Practices Act (PCC §§ 4100 et seq.) or any other contract requirements relating to subcontractors substitution
- 4) The awarding agency may consent to the subcontractor substitution in any of the following situations:
- a) After having a reasonable opportunity to do so, the subcontractor listed in the bid fails or refuses to execute a written contract presented to the subcontractor by the prime contractor. The written contract is based upon the general terms, conditions, plans and project specifications or the terms of that subcontractor's written bid.
- b) When the listed subcontractor becomes bankrupt or insolvent, or goes out of business.
- c) When the listed subcontractor fails or refuses to perform their subcontract.
- d) When the listed subcontractor fails or refuses to meet the prime contractor's bond requirements.
- e) When the prime contractor demonstrates to the awarding agency, or its duly authorized officer, that the subcontractor's name was listed as a result of an inadvertent clerical error.
- f) When the listed subcontractor is not licensed pursuant to any applicable licensing requirement of any regulatory agency

of the State of California.

- g) When the awarding agency, or its duly authorized officer, determines that the work performed by the listed subcontractor is substantially unsatisfactory and not in substantial accordance with the plans and specifications, or the subcontractor is substantially delaying or disrupting the work process.
- •Prior to the approval of the prime contractor's substitution request, the awarding agency, or its duly authorized officer, must give written notice to the prime contractor's listed subcontractor being substituted and the reasons for the request. The notice shall be served by certified or registered mail to the subcontractor's last known address.
- The noticed subcontractor has five days to submit a written objection to the substitution to the awarding agency.
   Failure to file the written objection constitutes the listed subcontractor's consent to the substitution.
- If written objections are filed, the awarding authority shall give at least five working days written notice to the listed subcontractor of the awarding agency's hearing on the prime contractor's substitution request.

#### Compliance

[Reference PCC, §10115.3]

The awarding agency is responsible for establishing a method of monitoring goal adherence. To verify a bidder's effort to seek out and consider disabled veteran business enterprises as potential subcontractors, the awarding department may use any of the following monitoring options:

[Reference State Contracting Manual 8.16, Rev 10/98]

Random verification of contact claimed

- by the bidder (either federal, state or local organizations);
- Review multiple bids submitted by the same vendor to verify independent effort and documentation. Evidence of insincere efforts may include:
- 1. Repeat unsuccessful contacts rather than trying a new contact.
- 2. Use of contacts that are out of business.
- 3. Business solicitations not relevant to the contract.
- 4. Copying of identical DVBE documentation packages.
- Review job-related bid evaluation criteria and how it was applied to subcontractor/ supplier bids;
- Contact DVBEs listed for participation prior to or upon contract award.

[Reference State Contracting Manual 8.15 (c), Rev 10/98]

If a bidder fails to comply with the contract goal requirements, the awarding department shall deem the bidder nonresponsive and ineligible for the

AB 409, which goes into effect January 1, 2000, requires the California Department of Veterans Affairs to appoint a DVBE Advocate to promote statewide DVBE participation.

AB 409 also requires the OSBCR to prepare an annual, statewide statistical summary detailing each awarding department's DVBE goal achievement.

Effective January 1, 1999, Assembly Bill 2405 established a Small Business Advocate network within state service. State agen-

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cies with an annual contracting program of \$100,000 or more are required to appoint a small business advocate to act as a liaison for small business.

State Agency Small Business Advocates are responsible for the following:

- Make contract solicitation information available to and consider offers from capable small businesses.
- Ensure prompt payment to small business.
- Consider small businesses under the California Multiple Award Schedule (CMAS) prior to placing an order.
- Identify and implement innovative acquisition processes to further small business participation.
- Appropriately prepare solicitations for simplification, efficiency, expedience, and cost effectiveness of response.
- Consider the following when determining a bidder award eligibility:
  - The necessary facilities, organizational capability, experience, managerial and technical competency and skills, and financial resources to fulfill the terms of the contract.
  - The capability to comply with required delivery or performance schedule, taking into consideration other business commitments.
  - The history of satisfactory or better performance, as demonstrated by a results-oriented track record, written performance evaluations, or other relevant information obtained from references.
